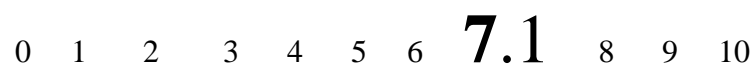


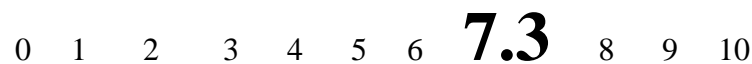
STUDENT Feedback Summary (November 2021)
